Board of Supervisors File No. 190248: [Planning Code - Uses in the Upper Market NCT and NCT-3 Zoning Districts] Ordinance amending the Planning Code to revise the NCT-3 (Moderate-Scale Neighborhood Commercial Transit) District controls to allow Arts Activities, Philanthropic Administrative Services, and Public Facilities as a principal use on all stories, revise the Upper Market Neighborhood Commercial Transit (NCT) District controls to allow Arts Activities and Institutional Uses as a principal use on the first and second stories and as a conditional use on the third story and above and to allow General Entertainment as a principal use on the first and second stories, modify the requirements for liquor stores and bars in the NCT-3 and Upper Market Street NCT Districts, add additional conditional use criteria for liquor stores and require liquor stores to comply with standard location and operating conditions, and add additional uses to the definition of Open Air Sales; affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act; making

findings of consistency with the General Plan, and the eight priority policies of Planning Code, Section 101.1; and adopting findings of public necessity, convenience, and general welfare under Planning Code, Section 302. (Discussion and Action Item)

5. **Board of Supervisors File No. 190164: Police Code - Acceptance of Cash by Brick-and-Mortar Businesses.** Ordinance amending the Police Code to require, in general, that brick-and-mortar businesses accept payment in cash in connection with the purchase of goods and services other than professional services. 6. Input from Businesses with Tobacco Permits and Presentation on Tobacco Statistics Pertaining to Board of Supervisors File No. 190312 [Health Code - Restricting the Sale, Manufacture, and Distribution of Tobacco Products, Including Electronic Cigarettes]

Ordinance amending the Health Code to prohibit the sale by tobacco retail establishments of electronic cigarettes that require, but have not received, an order from the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approving their marketing; and prohibiting the sale and distribution to any person in San Francisco of flavored tobacco products and electronic cigarettes that require, but have not received, an FDA order approving their marketing. Determination Regarding Eligibility of Original Joe's for Legacy Business Registry. The Legacy Business Registry applicant Original Joe's was closed for a five-year period from 2007 to 2012 due to a fire and relocation. For the Legacy Business Registry, a business must have operated in San Francisco for 30 or more years with no break in San Francisco operations exceeding two years. In the Rules and Regulations for the Legacy Business Registry, the Small Business Commission defined that as "no break exceeding two years in the existence of the business as evidenced through the business registration, and no break in physical operations exceeding four years. Exceptions may be made for exceptional circumstances ... as determined by the Small Business Commission." The Small Business Commission shall determine whether the fire is considered an "exceptional circumstance." (Discussion and Action Item)
